**Sermon Text: Titus 2:11-15**

### **OPENING QUESTION**

1. When you were a kid, what did your parents use most to motivate you: fear of punishment or offer of reward? What worked on you?

### **INTO THE BIBLE (Read Titus 2:11-15)**

2. If salvation is by God's grace, what does that imply about whether any human deserves help from God?
3. Why would some people be surprised that God's grace teaches Christians to renounce sin?
4. According to verse 14, why did Jesus come?
5. How does waiting expectantly for Jesus to come back empower people to live for God?

### **GOING DEEPER (Sharing/Application)**

6. If nobody deserves God to help them, how should this influence our prayers or expectations when we want God to help us?
7. How should grace influence the way we feel towards the kindness God does show us?
8. How can a person (either a Christian or non-Christian) practically spend time reflecting upon the coming of Jesus Christ?
